Introducing the AGRODEP Working Papers Series

s you will recall, it was agreed that we would discuss internally at AKADEMIYA2063 the best way of capitalizing on your papers accepted for presentation at the conference. Several options were tabled, including pushing for peer-reviewed papers, technical papers, conference proceedings, AGRODEP Working Papers Series, etc. After looking at all the options, we are opting to launch the AGRODEP Working Papers Series; the papers accepted for presentation at this year's conference will be published in this new series. We plan to publish the manuscripts as working papers, with the understanding that, as an author, you will still be able to further develop and adapt them for a peer-reviewed publication as you wish. We are currently receiving submissions of their revised papers from members considering the comments and suggestions they received from their peers assigned to review their papers prior to the conference.

AGRODEP Brown Bag Sessions

As discussed with you, we are exploring the possibility of publishing a set of conference papers in the AGRODEP Working Paper Series each quarter of the year. For each release, we can organize a **Brow Bag Session** that brings together all AGRODEP members, and possibly one or two external lead topical experts.

Finalizing the Conference Papers for Publication

Our Senior Scientist from the AGRODEP Team has been engaging with you individually on the finalization of your paper following the reviewers' feedback and the comments/suggestions received during the conference. You were given some time to incorporate those news elements before re-submitting the paper. We are happy to report that the feedback so far has been rather encouraging. In a week or so to come, we will kick off the scientific editing of the revised papers collected.

Because we truly believe in the notion that this consortium is a members' business, we intend to approach a few among you for each conference to serve as scientific co-editors of the AWPS, to ensure there is limited risk of gross misrepresentation of facts in papers. Once the work of scientific editors is completed, a professional copyeditor will be brought in to help finalize the papers before their release in the series.

AGRODEP Indicative Calendar of Activities

We promised to share with you an indicative calendar of activities of the AGRODEP Modeling Consortium. The matrix includes key activities to be undertaken by and with AGRODEP members between two conferences. Because we want the content to be a co-creation, you will be invited to input the plan before it is finalized. Welcoming 51 New AGRODEP Members! -

Back in May 2023, our team issued a public call to recruit prospective candidates who fulfil all the requirements to be selected and brought in as new members of AGRODEP. We are pleased to inform you that we recently completed our screening and evaluation of all the 272 applications received.

Of the 272 applicants, 40 were already members of AGRODEP, whose applications were mostly driven by their interest in one or more of the four new networks we also announced in the same call. After a thorough and rigorous evaluation of the applications, 51 applicants were selected to become new AGRODEP Members. On November 20, 2023, we organized an induction seminar to welcome and walk them through the AGRODEP ecosystem and what they can expect from this consortium while also engaging them on how their contribution could bring mutual benefits to the parties involved.

Impact Evaluation Training Using Panel Data

AGRODEP Modeling Consortium offers training courses and work opportunities to a network comprising about 300 hundred African researchers. Overall, the program facilitates the use of statistical, econometric, and economic modeling tools, promotes access to data sources, provides training, research grants, networking, and publication opportunities to its members, and supports collaboration between these and international researchers. Through a Memorandum of Understanding, the Royal Tropical Institute (KIT) of the Netherlands has agreed to support AKADEMIYA2063 in re-activating AGRODEP activities after the COVID crisis, starting from the reactivation of the Impact Evaluation network and its curriculum.

In 2019 and then again in 2021, KIT collected georeferenced panel data on about 12,000 farm-households from 7 sub-Saharan countries on behalf of the Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA) and its PIATA program (Partnership for Inclusive Agricultural Transformation in Africa). However, neither KIT nor AGRA had until now managed to produce any research using such a rich and unique dataset, which has the potential to provide key insights on the factors that determined the resilience or vulnerability of sub-Saharan farm-





households during the COVID crisis.

AKADEMIYA2063 accepted to organize this first AGRODEP training course together with KIT and AGRA, in order to bring together promising African researchers and produce collective and flagship publications based on the PIATA panel dataset, so as to inform the future strategy of AGRA moving forward.

Feedback from one trainee: "This was not a conventional training course, but a true learning experience for adult professionals. The separation between teacher and student, or between trainers

and trainees, was rather blurred, and all training activities were geared towards one specific objective, to collectively produce evidence-based and policy-oriented research".
